Justice Services' EFFECTIVE PROGRAMS



"Toward a better and more rewarding life."

Arizona criminal statutes mandate assessment and education or treatment programs, as appropriate, for those offenders cited for various misdemeanor offenses. These programs may be an alternative to or used in conjunction with conventional court-imposed sentences such as fines or incarceration, or used as a 'diversion' from prosecution by Prosecutors.

Justice Services has been meeting the needs of Court Judges, Prosecutors, and Probation officers for the past 29 years with innovative and effective cognitive-behavioral programs aimed at assisting those offenders in modifying behaviors "toward a better and more rewarding life." This is done by offering education and treatment programs that are curriculum driven and consistent with Best Practices techniques supported by the latest research into cognitive-behavioral change. Justice Services' philosophy is that change is, indeed, possible and life transforming to a willing participant.

TREATMENT PROGRAMS

All Justice Services' educational or treatment programs are preceded by a one-on-one clinical assessment by a trained counselor / therapist with experience in the issues surrounding the defendant's offense for which he or she was arrested. Typically, this assessment is followed by an education or treatment plan that is based on the results of the assessment. (If the referral is made by a Probation Officer or from the M CAPD there is only a short 'intake' session and the recommendations of the referring officer are automatically followed.) A screening summary is always sent to the referral authority and tracking / reporting of the client's progress is done according to the requirements of the referral authority. Written reports of 'compliance' or 'non-compliance' of the defendant are promptly sent to the referral authority upon program completion or noncompliant status.

SUPERVISION TECHNOLOGIES



Positive change, based on cognitive-behavioral models is possible and real.

Home Detention (as authorized by ARS § 41-1604.13) is a rapidly growing alternative to conventional incarceration. This supervisory tool for non-violent criminal defendants, using proven and robust electronic monitoring technology, is

capable of tracking the compliance of court-ordered defendants to a residential curfew schedule that requires a defendant to be in their residence during a specific time window but allows a schedule that may include work, school, treatment, community service, or other court-approved activity that may benefit the overall rehabilitation of the defendant. Such an alternative to jail allows the defendant to stay connected with family, continue to meet financial obligations through work, attend any treatment and yet be supervised as to location during other times. This supervision may be done using RF or GPS monitoring technology. In addition, if so ordered by authority, a defendant may be monitored for use of alcohol by remotely testing for BAL using either breath testing or transdermal migration technology.

A significant benefit to the referral authority is that jail costs are eliminated by transferring the cost directly to the Home Detention participant. These costs are modest and become part of the accountability component of rehabilitation.
